- 2. Comments shall be limited to 5 minutes per meeting, unless such time is extended by a majority vote of the Council members.
- 3. While the Council is in session, those in attendance must preserve order and decorum. No member of the public shall delay or interrupt the Council proceedings; disturb any member who may be speaking; or refuse to obey the orders of the Council or its presiding officer.
- 4. Prepared statements are welcome and should be given to the Finance Officer prior to a Council meeting. Prepared statements that are also read, however, shall be deemed unduly repetitious. All prepared statements for public hearings shall become part of the hearing record.
- 5. All remarks shall be addressed to the Council as a body and not to any member of the Council or Staff.
- 6. Public members recognized by the presiding officer, shall:
  - a. Stand, if able
  - b. For the record, give his/her name and address
  - c. If applicable, give the person, firm or organization he/she represents
  - d. Limit comments to the matter of fact
  - e. Address the Council as a body and not to any individual member of the Council or City Staff
  - f. Ask no questions of individuals who are Council members, staff or other public members, except through the presiding officer
  - g. Limit comments to a maximum of 5 minutes, unless such time is extended by a majority vote of Council members.

#### **MINUTES OF THE PARK & RECREATION COMMITTEE**

#### March Report

#### **Civic Center Facility Manager Report:**

Currently, the Civic Center is closed. During this time staff are cleaning out rooms and painting the gym area.

At the last council meeting the council tabled action on changing the pass rate for fireman. The overall feeling at the time was our fireman are a volunteer department and not compensated for the hours of time and energy spent training as well as called to emergency situations. They felt this is the least the City can do for fireman and their families.

#### **City Facilities:**

Swimming Pool: The swimming pool is shaping up. The gutters have been grouted and now the crew will prime and paint the pool. It will be ready by mid-May for swim team camp.

Luis has filled the pool manager position. The City is now looking for lifeguards. If you know of anyone interested please have them call City Hall (434-5222) and we will send an application.

**Roadrunner Recreation Trail:** Luis will try to have city staff grade and place millings in the north parking lot in the coming weeks. He has checked it several times to make sure the condition was usable.

Lake Shel-oole: The City has ordered the welcome signs for the Lake Shel-oole campground/ballfield entrance. Construction will take place in early spring.

The Community Pond Grant dock for Lake Shel-oole is progressing. We had 3 bids for docks and will select a vendor this week. With council approval on April 6<sup>th</sup>, we will order the dock for early summer installation.

**Tree Board:** Lorette is still planning for Arbor Day (April 24<sup>th</sup>) events which includes a city-wide cleanup and planting of trees. The Shelby Recycling Association will also hold the annual Mountain of Cans Challenge at Shelby Elementary School. The bid solicitation deadline for trees is April 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### **Other Business**

Upcoming Civic Center: Blood Draw ~ April 2<sup>nd</sup> (still scheduled, but may be held at the old Middle School) Chamber Banquet ~ April 29<sup>th</sup> (postponed)

#### City Attorney's comments regarding COVID Ordinance and Emergency Declaration

The purpose of the Ordinance and Declaration is to be eligible for FEMA cost share reimbursement for expenses the City may have related to the COVID-19 emergency. At this time, the FEMA cost share is 75%.

This emergency ordinance expires in 90 days or sooner upon Council vote. Two-thirds of the council must approve it. If approved, the second reading is waived and it is effective immediately.

City business is being conducted now as it has been since the last council meeting. Public access to City Hall and other City facilities is restricted, some meetings have been canceled, and some are still regularly conducted with social distancing requirements in place. In my meetings with Gary, Jade, and Lorette, the intent is to keep business moving as it has been.

I've had a number of conversations with other city attorneys and researched MMIA and the Montana League of Cities and Towns. The strong recommendation from these sources is to get an emergency declared for FEMA funding, in case we need it.

MMIA and MLCT provide a number of ordinance and declaration templates. The templates have language giving the mayor autocratic authority to cancel all meetings and just run things. Gary requested that I water that language down because the City has the ability to conduct meetings while adhering to current social distancing guidelines and orders. Therefore, the Council still must approve expenditures and contracts under this declaration. Remember that the Council has previously given the Mayor the authority to spend up to \$5,000. In the rare instance where the Mayor must make a decision related to the emergency and calling a special council meeting is not practical (i.e. decision must be made sooner than the 48 hour public notice requirement), then he can make that decision and later face the Council to justify it for retroactive approval.

The Ordinance does give Gary the authority to restrict citizens' movements and other pretty heavyhanded measures. By Montana statute, a mayor has these authorities under an emergency declaration. However, practically, we have no way to enforce these types of measures. And, in my discussions, I doubt he'll be more restrictive than the POTUS or Governor's orders, if at all.

## **ORDINANCE NO. 841**

# AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, MONTANA, ENACTING MEASURES TO REDUCE THE SPREAD OF THE 2019 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19), PROVIDING FOR THE CONTINUITY OF CITY BUSINESS, AND WAIVING A SECOND READING.

WHEREAS, coronaviruses are a large family of virus that cause illness ranging from the common cold to more serious diseases and are easily spread by person-to-person contact; and

WHEREAS, in late 2019 an outbreak of a new strain of coronavirus began in Wuhan, China; and

WHEREAS, on February 11, 2020, the World Health Organization named the new strain of coronavirus causing illness in China COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, cases of COVID-19 have been identified in a growing number of locations internationally, including the United States; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared a global pandemic due to the spread of COVID-19 but emphasized that containment is still possible; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Governor Steve Bullock declared a state of emergency related to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, President Donald Trump declared a national emergency related to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2020, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") issued interim guidance recommending the cancellation of events or gatherings that consist of 50 or more people for the next eight weeks to reduce the spread of COVID-19 which has subsequently been revised to gatherings of more than 10 people; and

WHEREAS, Governor Steve Bullock directed the closure of public schools for two weeks to reduce the spread of COVID-19 which he has subsequently extended to April 10, 2020, and will likely extend again, and strongly recommended the public limit all gatherings, especially those in excess of 50 people, in every community across the state which has subsequently been revised to gatherings of more than 10 people; and

WHEREAS, as of April 2, 2020, there have been 241 reported cases of COVID-19 in Montana with 6 of cases which has so far resulted in 3 deaths in Toole County; and WHERE, as Attorney General Tim Fox issued an AG's Opinion, which has the effect of law, regarding public meetings and public participation during the COVID-19 pandemic

WHEREAS, Mayor McDermott has directed the closure of City facilities to the public while continuing to provide services to the public remotely, cancelled some public meetings, and conducted other meetings under social distancing guidelines; and

WHEREAS, § 7-5-104, MCA, authorizes the City Council to waive the second reading of an ordinance passed in response to an emergency and provides such ordinance is effective upon passage; and

WHEREAS, an emergency ordinance requires a two-thirds vote of the whole City Council for passage and remains effective for no more than 90 days; and

WHEREAS, §§ 2-3-103 through 2-3-111, MCA, provide that public agencies must ensure that prior to a final agency decision is taken that is of significant interest to the public, adequate notice is given and the public is allowed a reasonable opportunity to participate; and

WHEREAS, § 2-3-112, MCA, provides § 2-3-103 through 2-3-111, MCA, do not apply to an agency decision that must be made to address an emergency situation affecting the public health, welfare, or safety; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 constitutes an emergency situation affecting the public health, safety and general welfare and proactively implementing mitigation measures to slow the spread of COVID-19 is in the best interests of the City and its inhabitants.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Shelby, Montana, as follows:

<u>Section 1:</u> All of the recitals set forth above are hereby adopted as Findings of Fact.

<u>Section 2:</u> The Mayor has the authority to cancel any public meeting on a weekby-week basis and, if he does not cancel a meeting, he may conduct it within the guidance of the AG's Opinion.

<u>Section 3:</u> The Mayor has the authority to close City property and City buildings including City Hall to the public on a week-by-week basis. Essential services at City Hall during closure will continue to be provided to customers remotely.

<u>Section 4:</u> The City temporarily waives all late fees and will not shut off service for delinquent water and sewer accounts through April 30, 2020. The Mayor is

authorized to extend such waivers on a week-by-week basis beginning April 30, 2020.

**Section 5:** The City will comply with the Families First Coronavirus Response Act and State law.

Section 6: If the Mayor cancels a regular City Council meeting at which the Council normally approves claims, the Mayor is hereby authorized to pay all claims and take any other such action authorized by law for public health, safety and welfare of the community, and for the continuity of business, which the Council will approve once the Council meets again.

<u>Section 7:</u> If waiting for a regular meeting of the Council or calling a special meeting of the Council is not practical, the Mayor has authority to approve contracts and expenditures in furtherance of implementing any and all adopted local disaster emergency plans and this Declaration, and taking all measures deemed necessary to address the emergency, subject to retroactive approval by the council.

<u>Section 8:</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Emergency Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall affect only that part held invalid, and the remaining provisions thereof shall continue in force and effect.

<u>Section 9:</u> This Emergency Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City council of the City of Shelby, Montana, and signing by the Mayor thereof.

# DECLARATION OF A STATE OF LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has declared the Coronavirus Disease ("COVID-19") a global pandemic that is controllable via precautionary measures to stop the spread of the disease;

WHEREAS, individuals in Montana have tested presumptive positive for COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Governor Bullock issued an Executive Order declaring an emergency to exist within the State of Montana related to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, the Shelby City Council passed Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ on April 6, 2020, enacting measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19, providing for the continuity of City business;

WHEREAS, Section 10-3-402, MCA, allows the principle executive officer of a local political subdivision to declare a state of local emergency ("Declaration") whenever the principle executive officer determines there is an emergency;

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Shelby is the principal executive officer of the City of Shelby;

WHEREAS, the City faces an imminent threat to life and public health resulting from COVID-19;

WHEREAS, the circumstances of this pandemic may exceed the capacity of the services, personnel, equipment, supplies, facilities, funding, and other resources of the City of Shelby, Montana;

WHEREAS, the availability and utilization of all necessary City services, equipment, and other resources will further the efforts to protect health and safety and to preserve the lives, property, and resources of the people of the City of Shelby, Montana;

# NOW, THEREFORE, AS MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, I HEREBY DECLARE:

1. A state of local emergency pursuant to Section 10-3-402, MCA.

2. This Declaration shall activate the response and recovery aspects of any and all adopted local disaster emergency plans and authorize the furnishing of aid and assistance in accordance with such plans.

3. The Mayor has the authority, pursuant to Section 10-3-406, MCA, to prevent ingress to or egress from all or part of the City and to direct law enforcement to enforce

quarantines and curfews in all or parts of the City concurrent with or at the direction of the County Board of Health Officer.

4. The Mayor will adhere to and implement all directives provided by the Governor of the State of Montana and the County Health Officer or Board of Health regarding the COVID-19 pandemic.

5. The Mayor may cancel meetings of boards, commissions, and advisory groups, and all other scheduled public meetings and hearings of the City Council in order to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

6. The Mayor has the authority to administer all affairs and departments of the City, including, but not limited to, implementing orders for employees to work from home and selfquarantine.

7. If waiting for a regular meeting of the Council or calling a special meeting of the Council is not practical, the Mayor has authority to approve contracts and expenditures in furtherance of implementing any and all adopted local disaster emergency plans and this Declaration, and taking all measures deemed necessary to address the emergency, subject to retroactive approval by the council.

8. If waiting for a regular meeting of the Council or calling a special meeting of the Council is not practical, the Mayor is authorized to enter into agreements and contracts and make purchases and expenditures without adhering to state and local procurement requirements, including those in Titles 7 and 18, MCA and to the City's purchasing policy. This authorization is limited only to agreements, contracts, purchases, and expenditures reasonably necessary to implement the Declaration and to no other agreements, contracts, purchases, or expenditures.

9. All City agencies are authorized to take appropriate action to assist the Mayor, federal, state, and local agencies, and other individuals in containing, preparing for, responding to, and recovering from this emergency, to protect City and local property, and to provide such other assistance as is necessary to protect the public health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the City, including any personnel, equipment, supplies, facilities, funding, and other resources deemed necessary to assist with finding, preventing, and combating COVID-19.

10. This Declaration is effective as of March 12, 2020 and shall terminate upon subsequent order from the Mayor of the City of Shelby.

11. Copies of this Declaration be filed with the County Clerk and Recorder, the City Clerk, and the Montana Disaster and Emergency Services Division in Helena.

12. The public shall be notified of this Declaration as soon as reasonably feasible through general dissemination to the news media, posting on the city website and social media accounts, or using other means of communication appropriate for informing the general public.

April 6, 2020

- The Community Ponds Grant public hearing in regard to the environmental assessment of the project is this evening. The environmental assessment is part of our administrative record and available to the public to review during City Hall work hours. The assessment shows there will be a slight change to the shoreline and approach road as the shoreline will be cleared of weeds and scrub trees in the shallow edge of the water where the dock will be installed. The road will also be bladed and graveled where necessary to enable ease of access and a concrete pad poured to allow those of limited mobility to exit vehicles and access the ramp/dock. The installation of the floating dock will have a positive impact in the ability of anglers and water enthusiasts to better access Lake Shel-oole with no diverse impact to the environment or human health. Mayor McDermott, Finance Office Goroski and I recommend we award the contract o Sunrise Docks of Polson, MT. They were the low bidder on the project. The bid was \$10,960.00. The other bids were from Valley Docks in the amount of \$12,250.00 and Glacier Docks in the amount of \$12,470.00. (action item)
- One bid to conduct the Preservation Plan for our Main Street Business District was received from Cushing Terrell. The Preservation project is intended to be a key element in community development and growing our business community, while maintaining the historic integrity of our downtown district. (See attached information) I would like to ask for approval to enter into an agreement with Cushing Terrell in the amount of \$20,000. The original budget and grant amounts are the following: Main Street Program ~ \$3,500.00; CDBG Planning Grant ~ \$18,000 and City of Shelby ~ \$3,000. With the bid coming in below budget we will seek to use all grant funding for the plan. (action item)
- Three bids for trees as part of our Arbor Day and Urban Forestry Development projects have been received. We have selected Transa-Tree for the purchase and delivery as low bidder. Trees will be replaced in the Swimming Pool/Splash Park complex; Fire Hall; and Shelby Town Hall entrance area.
- Storm water drainage work continues with Helena Sand & Gravel installing the last lateral at the Galena Street rail crossing. They will then complete curb/gutter work and paving to complete the project.
- The City has been chosen as one of 20 communities to participate in Reimagining Rural Communities virtual gathering. The statewide virtual event will feature a rural expert from the University of Minnesota Extension Center to talk about community vitality. They have postponed the event to this fall.
- The Humic Growth water extension has been pushed out until April because of the frost depth.
- We are still waiting on the agreements with BNSF City and MDT for the rail safety improvements project. KLJ is in correspondence with BNSF.
- Welcome signs for the North entrance into Shelby at the Lake Shel-oole Campground/Baseball fields have been ordered. These are part of the Office of Tourism wayfinding grant we received.
- Reunion plans are on hold until more is known of the progression of COVID 19.
- We are forwarding information on local business/community event changes through the city's Facebook page and trying to send pertinent information directly to businesses.

- I am currently updating our business development brochure which is available in a hardcopy here at City Hall, the Chamber office and on our website.
- At the April 20<sup>th</sup> meeting, we will host a public hearing in relation to a TSEP and RRGL grant application for water distribution improvements and bring before the council, the Water System Preliminary Engineering Report draft for approval.
- A new Section 533 Preservation Grant application from USDA RD is now available. This is a passthrough grant to assist multi-family housing units in weatherizing and improving their properties. I have sent out requests to several multi-family property owners/managers to see if there is an interest.

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## This project entails three primary goals:

- Coordinate the existing planning efforts: The historic preservation plan is a key element of Shelby's larger community and economic development goals of sustaining and growing the business community while maintaining the integrity of the historic business district.
- 2. Public Involvement: Develop a public outreach plan to integrate community values and goals into the plan.
- **3. Develop Final document** to be approved by the Shelby City Council as a separate plan.

After completing conditions assessments of the buildings in Shelby, develop an agreed-upon level of protection for various levels of building significance; and provide design guidelines and review processes for proposed work. The implementation of the final approach will include a redesign, setting goals, and outlining strategies for the city's historic preservation program. It is conceivable that the modifications will be sweeping, or minimal, or somewhere in between.

From here, planning tools – for efficacy, efficient document processing, appropriate design guidelines, transition zones, etc. – can be determined. The historic preservation program for Shelby needs to accommodate smart growth while protecting City's historic character. Other community needs – such as affordability, transition zones, and other land uses could also be included in the analysis. Cushing Terrell's team will respond to the above goals with the following approach:

- Research and assess the existing conditions of the historic buildings of downtown Shelby

Cushing Terrell hopes to channel that energy through public and small group forums to strive for consensus for the best outcome.

## ATTENTION: Information from the Small Business Administration

There continue to be many inquires/questions related to the SBA assistance and the COVID-19 pandemic. I understand for many it doesn't feel like you have the guidance from SBA to take action at this point. The fact is that we (SBA Montana District Office) are also awaiting guidance on this. Once the bill passed it went to SBA to develop that guidance. The bill provides for 15 and 30 day timelines for guidance development on different sections of the Act, although we are not anticipating that long a timeline at this point. As soon as we have guidance on implementation/training/etc. we will get it out right away (based on my calls with SBA HQ yesterday, I am anticipating we will have something this week). As a follow-up to the below update from last week, I wanted to provide some additional information which may be helpful:

### WHATS AVAILABLE NOW?

## ECONOMIC INJURY DISASTER LOANS:

Two SBA emergency capital programs are available today and more will be coming soon:

1. Low interest, long term Economic Injury Disaster Loans for up to \$2 million: The first payment is deferred for 12 months. The application has been simplified and can be completed 100% online through our improved web portal at <u>www.sba.gov/disaster</u>.

2. Economic Injury Disaster Loan Advance for up to \$10,000: The form to apply is part of the economic injury disaster loan application. If approved, these funds can be used for payroll and other operating expenses and will be forgiven.

These loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that can't be paid because of the disaster's impact. The interest rate is 3.75% for small businesses. The interest rate for non-profits is 2.75%.

# The website has received a number of upgrades and reports today are it is performing much better. Also, the application portal has been updated.

### WHAT'S NEXT?

## PAYCHECK PROTECTION PROGRAM https://www.sba.gov/funding-programs/loans/paycheck-protection-program

Now that the bill has passed it goes to the SBA for development of guidance/implementation procedures which was worked on over the weekend and continues to progress. It is anticipated that later this week (hopefully on Friday, but the SBA has 15 days to develop guidance on much of this) the SBA and Treasury Department will launch the new Paycheck Protection Program to help keep employees on payroll and small businesses operating. Additional information about this program will be shared in the coming days.

Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loans (below is a copy/paste) from the U.S. Senate Committee on Small Business & Entrepreneurship)

The program would provide cash-flow assistance through 100 percent federally guaranteed loans to employers who maintain their payroll during this emergency. If employers maintain their payroll, the loans would be forgiven, which would help workers remain employed, as well as help affected small businesses and our economy snap-back quicker after the crisis. PPP has a host of attractive features, such as forgiveness of up to 8 weeks of payroll based on employee retention and salary levels, no SBA fees, and at least six months of deferral with maximum deferrals of up to a year. Small businesses and other eligible entities will be able to apply if they were harmed by COVID-19 between February 15, 2020 and June 30, 2020. This program would be retroactive to February 15, 2020, in order to help bring workers who may have already been laid off back onto payrolls. Loans are available through June 30, 2020.

Again, as soon as we have additional information/guidance we will be providing right away.

### Summary of Port of Northern Montana board meeting April 2, 2020 (via conference call) Lorette Carter

- 1. Calumet Lubricants, Co.: Calumet continues to move and store cars within the facility. The lease committee continues work on a 3-year lease agreement.
- 2. Hinrich's Trading Company: The Hinrich scale purchase has been finalized and the Port is operating the scale using a code system to track and invoice users. They will be posting signage in the coming weeks.
- **3.** Pat's Off-Road, Inc.: Pat's Off-Road had a leak on the south tank which was fixed in February. Patrick Construction of Havre is completing some dirt work on their site at this time.
- 4. Savage Services Inc.: The master lease for multi-modal operations is still in negotiation.
- 5. Pacific Steel & Recycling: Business is progressing.
- 6. Dick Irvin Inc.: The Port is in negotiations with DII to move to new track 2970 to allow for expansion of Bridge Agri Partners into the facility.
- 7. Data Center Feasibility: The Port has invited several firms to make site visits to Shelby. These are on hold at this time.
- 8. Bridge Agi Partners: Bridge Agi is currently working with Hinrich's for the movement of peas and lentils at this time. With the border crossing closed, Curtis Shuck is acting on Bridge Agri's part to keep business moving within the facility.
- **9. Tauber Petrochemical Canada:** They continue working with Savage to move petro-chemicals north into Canada from the Gulf.
- **10. Track 2970:** The board approved the expense for Patrick Construction to complete track 2970. They should have the work completed by mid- April.
