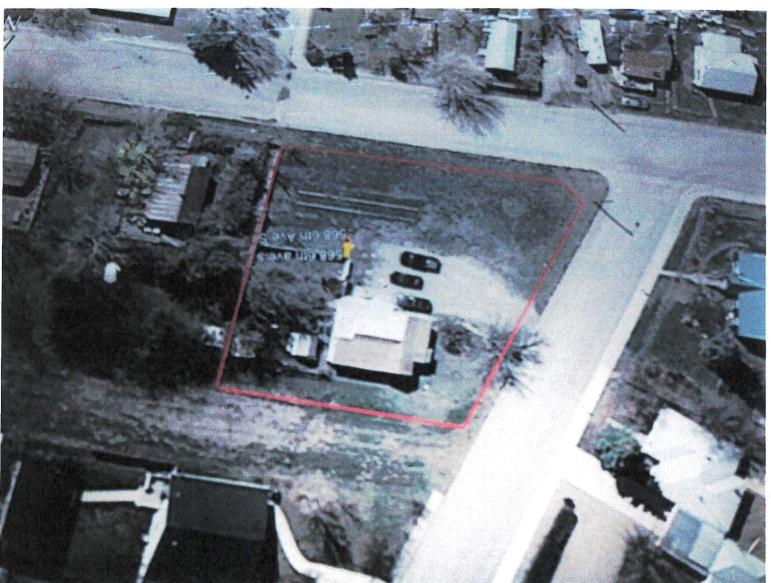

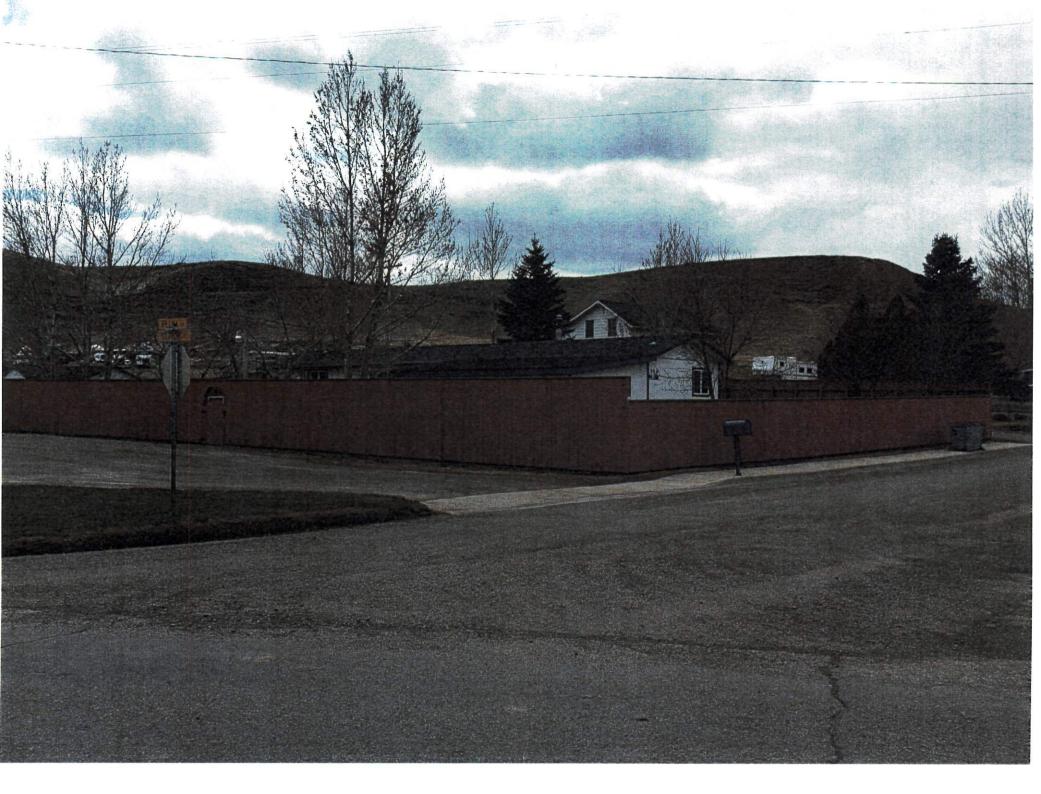

A - Fence to be placed 5' from curb at 6' tall needs variance for height and a signed fence on boulevard agreement.

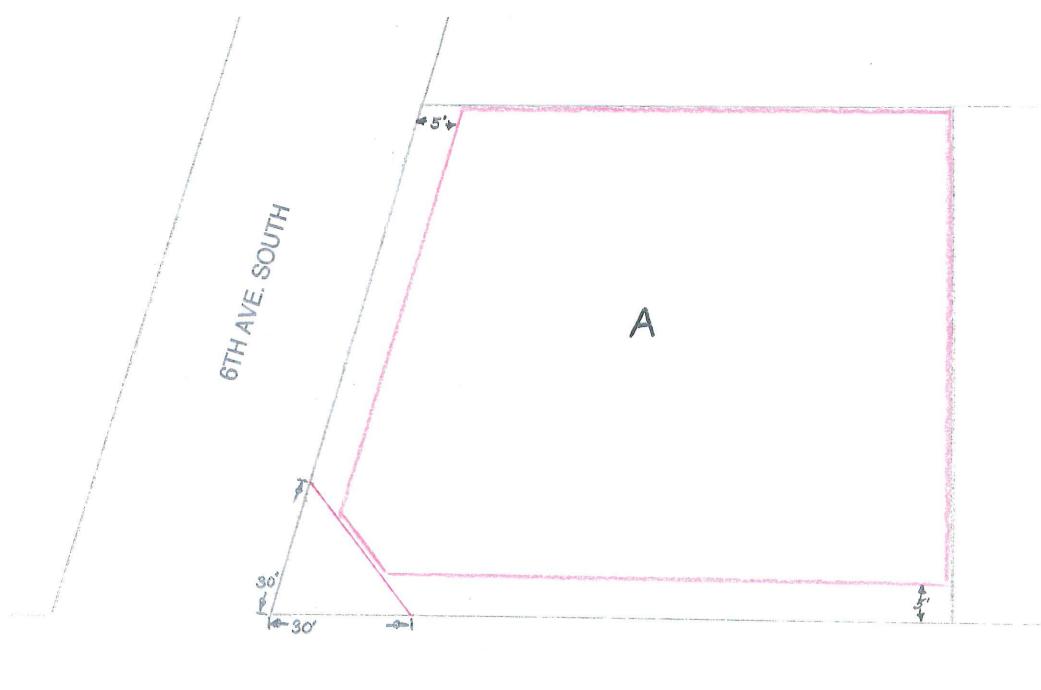
B – Fence to be placed at 12' from curb only needs a variance for height.

Both need to follow visibility at Intersections Ord.

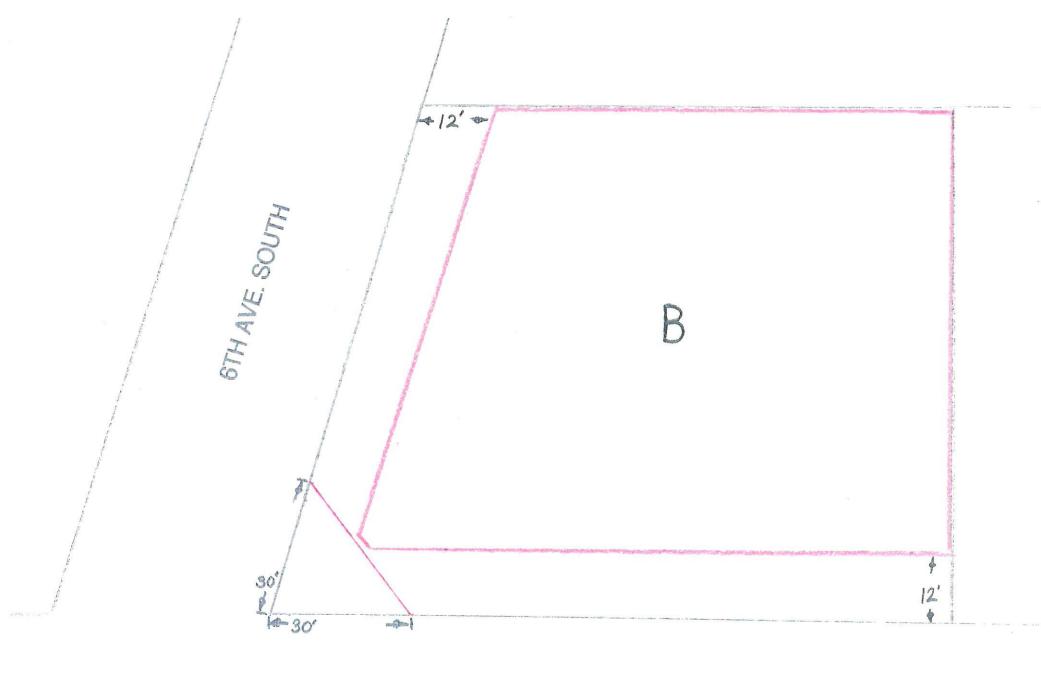
13-5-2: VISIBILITY AT INTERSECTIONS:

- A. Residential Districts: On a corner lot in any residential district, nothing may be erected, placed, planted, or allowed to grow in such a manner as materially to impede vision between a height of two and one-half feet $(2^{1}/2')$ and ten feet (10') above the centerline grades of the intersecting streets in the area bounded by the street lines of such corner lots and a line joining points along said street lines thirty feet (30') from the point of intersection of the curb line adjacent to the property. (Ord. 669, 8-19-1991)
 - B. Interference Visibility Of Traffic Signs:
- 1. Prohibited: On a corner lot in any municipal district, or on any boulevard adjacent thereto, nothing may be allowed to grow in such a manner as to materially impede the vision of oncoming motorists from seeing traffic signs. All traffic signs must be clearly visible to oncoming traffic for a distance of a minimum of one hundred feet (100').
- 2. Trimming Or Removal Of Plants Or Trees: In the event that any plant or tree obstructs the vision of oncoming motorists from clearly seeing traffic signs for a distance of a minimum of one hundred feet (100') from said sign, then the city shall take appropriate action by having said plants or trees trimmed back or removed to provide for adequate visibility as hereinabove specified. 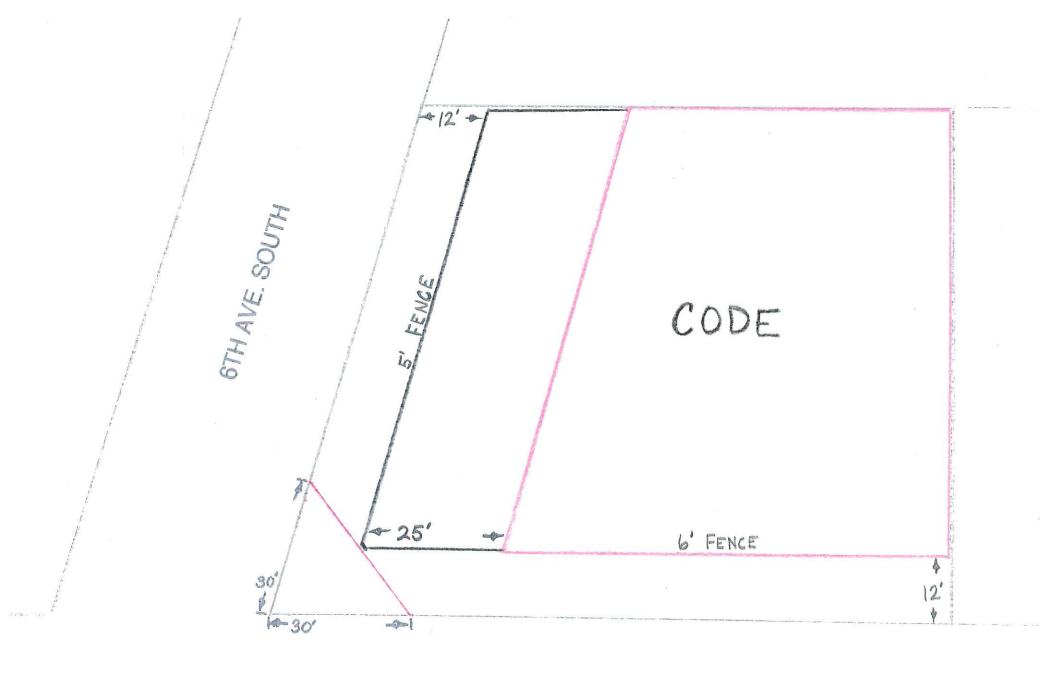

MINUTES OF THE PARK & RECREATION COMMITTEE

April 26, 2021

In attendance: Gary McDermott, Pat Frydenlund, Lyle Kimmet, Luis Correa, Jessi LaTray, Eric Tokerud and Lorette Carter reporting.

Civic Center:

Jessi reported the TV has been installed and toys purchased for the little ones in the Fun Zone (new name of the Teen Room). An email was received from Ariel Weishaar thanking the City for the beautiful new toys, kids chairs and table. She said the room is very welcoming and the little kids are thoroughly enjoying the new space and toys. Our Saturday attendant Michelle White's last Saturday is May 1st.

Summer activities at the Civic Center will include movie days on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month and roller skating will be Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00 p.m.to 3:00 p.m.

Classes will continue through the summer with some changes to hours as the summer is less busy.

Swim team signups will be Tuesday, April 29th at the Civic Center. Swimmers will also need to purchase a monthly pool pass.

Jessi will begin advertising if someone wants to play walleyball or basketball over the weekend, they can check out the walleyball net and balls from the office and return on Mondays. This creates a system to track who is responsible for the equipment. Rob is still working with lan Odden to get the lockers for the hallway and install coat hooks.

City Facilities:

Roadrunner Recreation Trail: Word has been received on the RTP grant application for a single-track mountain bike trail. Fish Wildlife & Parks awarded the City \$29,840.00 which is half of the estimated construction cost of the trail build (\$59,680.00). City officials will participate in a conference call with FWP grant specialists in early May to complete the start-up documentation.

The Shelby Lions Glub moved the Diabetes Awareness Walk from June to September because of conflicts:

This spring or early summer the City crew will initiate a trail sealing project to extend the life to the asphalt.

Krysko Skate Park: Lorette reported the Montana State Parks Land Water Conservation Fund application was not submitted to the National Park Service for April funding as the MT LWCF 2019 funds still needed to be distributed. The Shelby City Council approved \$30,600.00 in which to complete concrete work, irrigation and sod this spring. Lorette rewrote the LWCF grant application to reflect the work that will be completed and requested funding to construct the play structure in Meadowlark Park and the amenities for Krysko Park. The city crew is currently tearing out the concrete

on the west side and will bring in good fill dirt before other work begins. LWCF award announcement will be in late summer. The cameras have been purchased for the skate park and will be installed in the coming weeks.

Swimming Pool: City staff has been working at the pool painting locker rooms and doors on the interior and exterior. A new sign will be installed at the gate entrance of the Splash Park and the funder sign will be installed on the pool exterior leading into the Splash Park. The pool inspection was conducted and our pool is too shallow as per regulations for a diving board. The inspector did suggest seeking a variance. Luis will look into the variance. He will also work with Lexy on staff scheduling and a cell phone usage policy for lifeguards. City Hall will work on internet capacity to streamline the purchase of passes.

Kristen Russell emailed the following: "Swim team sign-ups are scheduled for Tuesday, April 27th at the Shelby Civic Center. This will make it easier for purchasing of pool passes for the summer. We are still hoping to start practice in the pool by May 31st. Our Shelby Swim Meet is scheduled for Saturday, June 5th. It will most likely be a one-day meet, but if that changes, we will let Lexy know ASAP."

It was suggested the City offer a free day of swimming, possibly the first week of June in the evenings before school lets out. Lexy can make that decision with her lifeguards if they need training days.

The Splash Park components will be installed in mid-May as weather permits.

Shelby Park System: Luis reported he will have 5 seasonal park employees this summer. The Shel-oole baseball bathrooms have been opened for the summer. The campground bathrooms will follow. Terry will make improvements to the campground bathroom this summer.

An application to AARP was submitted for the creation of a dog park at Lake Shel-oole Campground Area.

The City has purchased park signs in the same color/design as the welcome signs. Rob Tasker will begin installing the signs later in May.

The City also received word they have been awarded funding for a third welcome sign for the west entrance into Shelby.

Historic Shelby High: Luis reported the ditch that was trenched on the back side of the grass area of the property will be repaired.

Champions Park: Work continues at Champions Park on the lighting. Pat Barber said he should have it complete by mid-May. The Champions Park Committee has ordered another sponsored bench from Blue Imp of Medicine Hat. The bench is in honor of Theo and Herb Kluth. Deb Clark, committee member, has sold an additional 20 homesteader stones. The Committee will collect field stones and get them to Glacier Monuments in the next month. The Committee hopes to complete the monument sign this summer. The Committee has also scheduled a centennial celebration for July 4, 2023 at the Park.

Tree Board:

Tree Amigos of Great Falls will be in Shelby, May 11th to remove 10 Green Ash trees as part of the Hazardous Tree Removal Grant. The trees will be removed from the former Bitterroot School – south side and Historic Shelby High – east side. The City has ordered new trees as part of the Montana Community Urban Forestry Grant, Arbor Day Grant and Urban Forestry Development Grant. They will be planted in late May.

New Business:

Main Street vacant store fronts: City Attorney Bill Hunt is working on an agreement for the artists – City and property owners for displaying artwork in vacant store front windows. Erin Wanken has several local artists lined up to display personal artwork. Eric Tokerud, committee member, has also connected the City with the SHS art teacher to see if there are students interested in painting windows.

Arbor Day: Friday, April 30th is Arbor Day. Shelby students and staff will be cleaning around the school campus; sports complex; Aronow Park, and several other public areas within our community Thursday, April 29th. Other groups cleaning an area of the community include: Marias Medical Center; Marias Heritage Center; Leavitt Group; St. William's Youth Group; Chamber; Toole County 4-H Ambassadors; Shelby Swim Team; and Shelby Baseball Association.

Spring Clean Up ~ April 19th **- 29**th: The City has been collecting garbage this week as part of Clean Up Week. If residents don't have a means to get large items to the landfill they can always call the City Shop to assist in picking up items.

Mountains of Cans Challenge: The Shelby Recycling Association is hosting the 5th annual aluminum collection event with Shelby Elementary students. Students will bring their aluminum cans before school on the morning of Friday, May 14th. Each class will have a section of the parking lot to drop off crushed cans. The grade with the largest volume of cans will win a roller-skating party compliments of the City. They will also receive recycling bags from the Shelby Recycling Association. Mr. Tokerud's students will help transfer the cans to the aluminum trailer. Recycling member, Crissy Bauman will then transport the trailer to Steel Etc., Great Falls. In past years, students have brought over 1,000 pounds of aluminum cans.

With no further business, the next meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 24, 2021.

RESOLUTION NO. 2032

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION OF THE CITY OF SHELBY TO INCREASE LANDFILL RATES FOR RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL USERS EFFECTIVE JUNE 2021 BILLING

WHEREAS, the City of Shelby, Montana (the "City") owns and operates a landfill to dispose of garbage; and,

WHEREAS, the City also provides a garbage collection service which collects garbage from residential and commercial customers; and,

WHEREAS, the City owns and operates equipment to properly dispose of garbage at the landfill; and,

WHEREAS, the City pays its employees to dispose of garbage in and maintain the landfill; and,

WHEREAS, the City has certain other financial obligations associated with the landfill such as contributing to a fund to close it after its useful life and debt service; and,

WHEREAS, the funds for providing garbage collection and landfill come from the City's Solid Waste Fund; and,

WHEREAS, the City has not increased its garbage collection and landfill rates since November, 2014; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to increase the landfill rates in order to provide for sufficient funds to operate and maintain the landfill; and,

WHEREAS, the City proposes to enact an ordinance increasing the rates for garbage collection and landfill incrementally with landfill rates increasing effective June 2021 billing and garbage collection increasing effective June 2022 billing.

WHEREAS, the City is providing notice and a public hearing prior to the passage or enactment of an ordinance or resolution imposing, establishing, changing or increasing rates, fees, or charges for landfill rates.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council (the "Council") of the City as follows:

- Section 1. Reason for Proposed Increase in Landfill Rates. It is the intent of the City to implement a rate increase for users of the landfill as set forth herein. The reason for the proposed increase in rates is that the City will need to increase rates in order to pay for cost of service, recent repairs, current and future maintenance, inflation and debt service.
- Section 2. Existing Rate Charge. The City currently imposes a rate charge on the landfill which is not sufficient to the amount necessary to pay the costs of maintaining the landfill, cost of service and debt service. The current Rate Charge for customers are:

Dear Mayor and City Council:

We would like to request an amendment for additional work completed on the Shelby Front Street Lighting/C&G project. The original project included survey, design, and construction engineering for the following:

- 1. Curb and Gutter along the north side of Highway 2 from 7th Avenue to Wilson Avenue
- 2. 340 feet of sidewalk along the south side of Highway 2 between 7th and 8th Avenue
- 3. Drainage issue along the west side of 9th Avenue near entrance to MRE office
- 4. Drainage issue at the intersection of 12th Avenue and Marias Valley Road
- 5. Lighting along both sides of Highway 2

In addition, the following items were also completed for the project:

- 1. Survey and design of the drainage issue at the intersection of 6th Avenue and Highway 2
- 2. Survey and design of 100 feet of sidewalk along the south side of Highway 2 between 5th and 6th Ave.
- 3. Survey and design of 380 feet of sidewalk and approach between 6th Avenue and 7th Avenue
- 4. Survey and design of 535 feet of sidewalk between 9th and 11th Avenue
- 5. Survey and design of 560 feet of sidewalk and approaches between 12th Avenue and Harding Avenue
- 6. Survey of 480 feet of sidewalk between Harding Avenue and Wilson Avenue
- 7. Re-design of the lighting and analysis to utilize lighting only on the north side of Highway 2 when business owners did not accept lighting on the south side of Highway 2
- 8. Asphalt improvements along Marias Valley Road
- 9. Hydraulic analysis for curb and gutter and inlets along the north side of Highway 2 from Marias Valley Road to Wilson Avenue as required by MDT

Exhibit A includes the original agreement items shown in green and the additional items shown in purple.

Our budget for the project is \$68,500 and we have currently expended \$77,075.05 at a rate of \$125/hour for Engineer III and \$105 for Engineer I through design and bidding. The remaining work includes construction engineering, which we will limit as much as possible, while providing oversight to see that the project is constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications.

Due to the additional work noted above, we are currently over budget by \$77,075.05 - \$68,500 = \$8,575.05. We anticipate an additional \$14,900 to perform construction engineering for the project and incorporate laydown curb into the project as requested. We would like to respectfully request an amendment for \$8,575.05 + \$14,900 = \$23,475. Although the project has been adjusted to only construct some of the items that were designed, the work completed can be utilized for the upcoming TA grant applications along with construction of the project in the future.

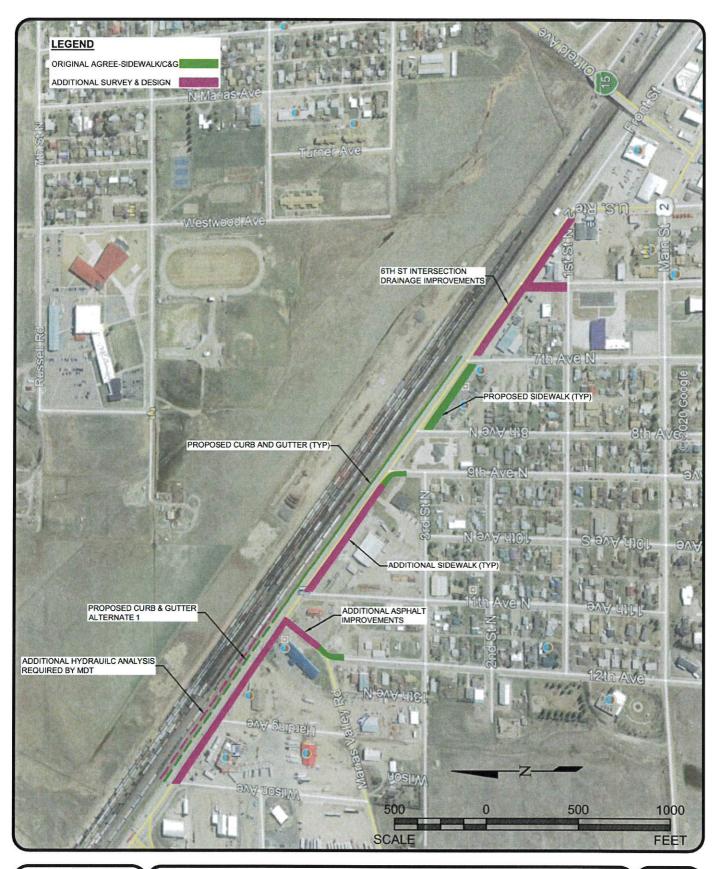

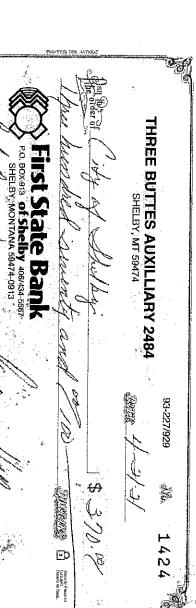
