2. Comments shall be limited to 5 minutes per meeting, unless such time is extended by a majority vote of the Council members.
3. While the Council is in session, those in attendance must preserve order and decorum. No member of the public shall delay or interrupt the Council proceedings; disturb any member who may be speaking; or refuse to obey the orders of the Council or its presiding officer.
4. Prepared statements are welcome and should be given to the Finance Officer prior to a Council meeting. Prepared statements that are also read, however, shall be deemed unduly repetitious. All prepared statements for public hearings shall become part of the hearing record.
5. All remarks shall be addressed to the Council as a body and not to any member of the Council or Staff.
6. Public members recognized by the presiding officer, shall:

 - d. Limit comments to the matter of fact
 - e. Address the Council as a body and not to any individual member of the Council or City Staff
 - f. Ask no questions of individuals who are Council members, staff or other public members, except through the presiding officer
 - g. Limit comments to a maximum of 5 minutes, unless such time is extended by a majority vote of Council members.

Loren Skartved reported the pool heater has been removed, flags and flowers on Main Street have been put up, fixed a water leak, three summer help positions have started, the crew has been durapatching the streets and the crew has also started two weeks of sewer jetting.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR

- **Special thanks to Superintendent Elliott Crump and School District #14 for hosting the Tree City celebration. It was a great event. Also special thanks to Loren and the crew for planting all the trees at Champions Park. We had additional funds and so have ordered 12 more trees for Main Street and Lake Sheloole Sports Complex and Campground.**
- **Special thanks to the Shelby Baseball Association, Shelby Junior High, NaturEner, Leavitt Group, Comfort Inn, St. William RE kids and Deb Clark and grandkids for conducting community cleanup activities in celebration of Arbor Day.**
- **The final EDA reporting has been completed and we are waiting on close out approval for the Data Center Feasibility Study. The study can be found on our website under *Resources*. Consultant, Patrick Boss has also initiated marketing of the study through technical publications and industry professionals.**
- **We did receive word that the Heights Trail project did not receive funding. The committee said we would have better luck applying through the Transportation Alternatives grant program because it is a shared-use pathway.**
- **The Social Media Committee has begun a new campaign for June ~ “Let Summer Begin” and initiated several new series. The overall theme is “Champion Shelby”. On Mondays posts will include Shelby amenities and businesses listed on TripAdvisor. The hope is to increase reviews and encourage travelers to stop and stay in our community. On Thursdays, I am posting historic pictures and information. Posts through the month of June include Shelby’s beginning; Historic Shelby Town Hall; the O’Haire Manor sign; the fire of 1959; and old Shelby Swimming Pool. We will continue with the Champion Shelby theme throughout the summer.**
- **We still have not received word from the National Arts Council on our HiLine Arts Trail grant application for an interactive kiosk at Champions Park.**
- **The Shelby Recycling Association is currently working with DEQ to host another e-waste collection event in Shelby. We will have to charge for TVs and computer monitors this time. A date has not be established as of yet. The group will also conduct a cleanup night at the recycling site on June 14th.**
- **The Shelby/Toole County Transportation Safety Committee/DUI Task Force met on May 25th. The 2017-2018 DUI Task Force work plan was approved. Projects include advertising during the holiday season to encourage safe driving; prevention activities including another high school Power of Choice day; Red Ribbon Week support for area schools; financial assistance to initiate the DARE program again; support RASS training and compliance measures within Toole County; and give recognition to our Sheriff’s Department with an appreciation breakfast. Gateway Recovery Specialist Mary Miller is now a certified RASS trainer and she will be conducting new server training every 2 months beginning this month.**

- Gateway Recovery Services and local committee members have scheduled National Night Out for Tuesday, August 1st in Aronow Park. There will be food, music, games, a child seat safety inspection, and informational tables from area law enforcement agencies and community organizations.
- In addition to North Town Drug, Gateway Recovery Services has purchased 2 prescription drug drop boxes. People can drop off their outdated, unused prescription medications at the Toole County Sheriff's Office and Sunburst Clinic.
- The Office of Community Development is currently working on a CDBG-Public Facilities grant opportunity for additional funding to finance another section of storm water infrastructure improvement on the north-east side of Shelby. Public hearings on the city's general needs and this specific project are planned for June 19th and July 10th. The grant submission deadline is July 14th.
- Through the generosity of CoreCivic Safety, the City of Shelby is auctioning a one-of-a kind play house now on display at the corner of Main and Galena/Montana. The on-line auction is taking place through the City's Facebook page through the month of June. The proceeds of the sale will go to continue to softscape plan for the Splash Park. This phase will include the build of a picnic area in the south/west corner of the park.

ORDINANCE NO. 832

ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CITY OF SHELBY,
MONTANA, AMENDING THE EXISTING SANITARY
SEWER SYSTEM ORDINANCE TO MODIFY THE RATES
AND CHARGES FOR THE MUNICIPAL SANITARY SEWER
SYSTEM

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City of Shelby, Montana (the "City") has passed and adopted a Sewer Ordinance as amended [most recently] on November 3, 2014 (the "Original Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, _____ Monthly User's Service Charge of the Original Ordinance, as amended from time to time, establishes the amount of rates and charges for use and availability of the City's municipal sanitary sewer system (the "System"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council (the "Council") desires to amend the Original Ordinance to increase rates and charges applicable to the System; and

WHEREAS, the amendment set forth in this ordinance is being done in conjunction with the City's anticipated issuance of sanitary sewer system revenue bonds (the "Bonds"), proceeds of which will be used to pay a portion of the costs of designing and constructing improvements to the System and costs of issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of the Bonds will cause the rates and charges for use of the System to increase, as set forth more particularly below; and

WHEREAS, prior to the second reading hereof, a duly called and noticed public hearing shall have been held and the proposed rate and charge increase shall have been approved in accordance with applicable law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City as follows:

Section 1. Amendment to _____ Monthly User's Service Charge of the
Original Ordinance. | Monthly User's Service Charge of the Original
Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows in its entirety:

The following charges shall become effective with the July 2017 billing:

1. Residential: All residential customers of the city sewer system shall be charged a flat rate sewer charge of twenty dollars and ninety cents (\$20.90) per month plus four dollars and fifty cents (\$4.50) per thousand gallons. The total annual volume of all sewage will be computed

as four times the water meter reading for a three consecutive month reading period during the months of November through March of each fiscal year.

2. Nonresidential: All commercial customers of the city sewer system shall be charged a flat rate of twenty dollars and ninety cents (\$20.90) per month plus four dollars and fifty cents (\$4.50) per thousand gallons. The volume will include a total annual metered usage exclusive of any irrigation water measured through a secondary meter.

1-12-12 B. 4. ← Section 2. Deletion of Correctional Facilities Charges. The charges shown under Section 1-12-12: Sewer Rates and Charges of the Original Ordinance for Correctional Facilities are deleted in their entirety and sewer charges for Correctional Facilities are governed by the sewer charges set forth above.

Section 3. Conflict with Other Ordinances or Resolutions. All parts of ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. This ordinance shall be construed liberally so that the amendment set forth herein comports with the balance of the unamended Original Ordinance. Except as amended hereby, the Original Ordinance shall remain unamended and in full force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and the Original Ordinance shall be amended hereby from and after 30 days following its passage by the City Council on second reading and approval by the Mayor. The changes to the rates and charges for use or availability of the System are scheduled to be implemented in the first complete billing period following the effective date of this ordinance.
